The Boilers Are Here! Well, almost...

There will be a slight delay on the boiler project. When our contractor opened all the crates, he found the control panel is being sent separately and is scheduled to arrive this week, and he wants to run a demo before bringing everything over. So, we will do the

tear-out of the old system next Thurs-Fri (June 25-26) and start installation of the new system on Monday, June 29th, which will extend the project into the first week of July.. Liz Osborne will be on hand to oversee the work. The project will take 2-3 weeks to complete, so plan to bring a sweater to church if the weather is cool. This project has been funded by generous gifts, a Puget Sound energy grant, bequests and the parish's Building & Grounds funds.
