A Prayer Tent . . . Now Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, and called it The Tent of Meeting." Anyone inquiring of the Almighty would go to the Tent of Meeting outside the camp. Exodus 33:7.

Tents are mentioned in both the Old and New Testa-

ments. In the Book of Exodus, tents were outside the confines of the encampment, where only Moses and Aaron would meet with God. The portable tent was called a Tabernacle or the "Tent of Meeting." It was a reminder that God was with them. The tent was a private place where Israelites could speak with God.

Think of a time from your childhood or your own children's when they made tents out of available throws, chairs and pillows. They were playing "camping out". A tent - It was a place of being safe and secure where you could have conversations with your siblings or a friend.

At Gatherings we will provide you with a mini folded tent that you can write what your prayers for Christ Church will be and we will collect them. The prayers will, of course be anonymous. We will display the finished tents in a way where we can all see them.

Our church is also a special place: for prayer, for solitary contemplation, for celebrating The Word with our community. We go to solitary places to make big decisions such as the Capital campaign and we invite you to do so after you have gathered enough information. We all know that just as the U District and society norms have changed, so too we must adjust our physical church to make it available for how we want to be in the future. Informational Gatherings Coming Up

The Campaign starts with a Pipe Organ

When you enter the sanctuary, your eyes are drawn to the pipes, and the beautiful wood work supporting it. The organ used to produce Flutes, trumpets, reeds, bourdons and clairabels! But not anymore. Ears can be deceived. There is a loud sound of the organ when it is played, but nothing more. It is an instrument that organists do not want to play and it will soon be unable to make a noise.



But all things have a lifespan. The Vestry knew this from very credible information from Henry, our previous musician organist In 2018 we bought a replacement that would not have the same fate: a tracker organ that relies not on electrical relays but mechanical pulleys and wheels to get the bellows air thru the right pipes. The only electrical need is to run the bellows. Our new organ is a Hook & Hastings built for St. John's of Taunton Massachusetts in 1874. It was last restored in 1959 so it is currently starting restoration in April at Andover Organs in Massachusetts to replace worn leathers and felts. The decorations on the pipes are the flowers on the sides of this newsletter. It is an instrument organists will want to play.

To place this instrument we needed to reconfigure the Sanctuary to accommodate the different sized pipe organ. In addition it was time to build a ramp for

accessibility into the Sanctuary from outside and to make the actual Sanctuary accessible to all.


